



BREXIT CHECKLIST FOR TRADERS

February 2019

ASSESS WHETHER YOUR BUSINESS TRADES WITH THE UK OR MOVES GOODS THROUGH THE UK

If it does:

- REGISTER** your business with the national customs authority to trade with non-EU countries, if you have not done so yet.
- ASSESS** whether your business has the necessary **resources and capacity** (staff, access to IT systems, storage...) and holds all necessary **customs authorisations** to import or export.
- ASK** your national customs authority which existing customs **simplifications and facilitations** are available for your business, such as guarantees and transit simplifications.
- CONSIDER** applying for **Authorised Economic Operator** (AEO) status from your national customs authority.
- TALK** to your **business partners** (suppliers, intermediaries, carriers...) as Brexit might also impact your supply chain.
