## ASSESS WHETHER YOUR BUSINESS TRADES WITH THE UK OR **MOVES GOODS THROUGH THE UK**

## If it does:



**REGISTER** your business with the national customs authority to trade with non-EU countries, if you have not done so yet.

ASSESS whether your business has the necessary resources and capacity (staff, access to IT systems, storage...) and holds all necessary **customs authorisations** to import or export.

ASK your national customs authority which existing customs simplifications and facilitations are available for your business, such as guarantees and transit simplifications.



**CONSIDER** applying for **Authorised Economic Operator** (AEO) status from your national customs authority.

**TALK** to your **business partners** (suppliers, intermediaries, carriers...) as Brexit might also impact your supply chain.
